

How many books do you read a year?

Between 20 and 120. I take my Gemini seriously and read widely based on my mood. Sexy vamps and corset-clad witches? Charlaine Harris or Hailey Edwards. Dangerous emotional love triangles? Maggie Stiefvater, Cassandra Clare, or Sarah J. Maas. Sometimes I want to longhaul it with Brandon Sanderson's heroic fantasy epics or Adrian Tchaikovsky's astonishing science fiction. Other times I want the quiet intimacy of a nonfiction memoir, like *Educated* or *Lightning Flowers*—or a satisfying foray into sword and sorcery with Mercedes Lackey's old Valdemar trilogies. And then there are the days I want to delve into deeply researched, science-based explorations of the body and mind with books like Matthew Walker's *Why We Sleep* and Pete Walker's *Complex PTSD*.



My favorite thing is binging, whether we're talking sweets or shows or stories, but sometimes committing to an epic storyline feels daunting. So I wanted to lower the entry fee for *Rangers of the Rift*. I wanted readers to be able to dip their toes in and go a little deeper with each episode. I wanted them to uncover each new plot thread one layer at a time. But I also wanted readers to be able to own beautiful paperbacks. That's why I wrote the episodes to fit into three novel-length seasons that would look fantastic on their bookshelves.

My author influences



And of course, my rich background in Christianity and knowledge of scripture and the ancient Christian church also contributed to the making of the *Rangers of the Rift* dark urban fantasy series.

Maybe the greatest inspiration for this series was actually Philip Pullman's *His Dark Materials* and my own personal journey with Complex PTSD and discovering my pixels (please refer to the movie *Inside Out*).



How did you come up with the magic system—life energy, death energy, etc?

In a hot tub with a little girl who kept peppering me with questions about my book and my mom who kept answering. We were all three prunes before it was over. Now I wouldn't be able to keep it all straight without the help of my systemsoriented brother who brainstorms with me whenever I get stuck.

Will you write another series or book in the ROTR series?

That's a definite down-the-road possibility! I want to explore some other ideas, too, so it will probably depend on my Gemini mood.

What's next for you after ROTR?

I have a bunch of projects in the works. I want to brush off a middle grade historical fantasy quartet (think *Harry Potter* in the 1900s with fairies). There's a YA dystopian zompire trilogy I'd like to complete. I have an epic fantasy duology on the backburner. I'm dying to write a queer rock climber thriller. I've fully outlined a science fantasy novel with series potential (think *Star Wars* meets *The Dragonriders of Pern*). And I want to co-write a few science fiction novels with my partner, probably of the ecopunk, cyberpunk, and solarpunk varieties—we believe that fiction should envision better worlds. A PTSD/Christian cult memoir might be on the horizon as well.
